Sydney Loofe Memorial Scholarship

Applicants to the Sydney Loofe Memorial Scholarship must:

- · Have a GPA of 3.0 or higher
- · Eligible High Schools: Nebraska High Schools (Public, Private or Exempt)
- · Demonstrate plans to attend an institution of higher learning that will make an impact on the community in the interest of safety, and the desire to protect the vulnerable in the areas of:
- o Countering human trafficking
- o Online safety
- o Cyber security

This list is not comprehensive. The individual must be able to demonstrate in their essay how their degree can make a difference in the lives of others.

- Deadline: March 19, 2021 by 5:00 PM
- · Award Amount: \$4000

Directions on how to submit the application will be enclosed.

- · Submission may be sent via email to in PDF format or via snail mail at 11620 M Circle Omaha, Nebraska 68137.
- · All materials must come in one email or one envelope.
- \cdot Students should attach their resume. Optional additional attachments of activities page or list of awards is also accepted.
- · Students should attach their transcript.
- \cdot A complete application will include a cover page with name, school, desired undergraduate degree, email address and home address.

· Please pay attention to the essay guidelines, as described on the application.

Additional Requirements

- 1. Two letters of recommendation from a teacher, counselor, coach or supervisor.
- 2. A completed application form.

The scholarship will be awarded in May 2021. The Set Me Free Project will hold a celebratory event to award the scholarship, and the student receiving the scholarship should attend, family and friends are welcomed.

Greetings from the Admissions office at Concordia University, Nebraska.

Here are a few brief updates on our university that may be of interest to students.

Financial Aid Offers

Concordia has already delivered over 250 financial aid offers to families for fall 2021 and those offers average nearly \$25,000 in scholarships and grants (totaling more than \$6,000,000). Over the coming months we will deliver many hundred more financial aid offers and award many millions more in aid. Thank you for continuing to encourage your students and families to complete their FAFSA. As seen below, many of our students only pay 1/3 of our overall cost once they go through our financial aid process:

University of Nebraska-Lincoln

As winter break approaches, we know you're working hard to help apply to college. To better assist you as you set them up for success, we've included important upcoming deadlines and scholarship information for you to pass along to your students.

We are excited to announce the new *Nebraska Career Scholarships* program: if your students are interested in working where Nebraska needs them most, **they could be awarded a scholarship of at least \$8,000 per year.** This program can support your students both financially and through hands-on learning experiences they can use to build a foundation for your entire career.

As a reminder, Nebraska is test optional this school year due to public health concerns. **To support** students, the University of Nebraska–Lincoln has eliminated the ACT or SAT from our admission and scholarships requirements.

Greetings from Peru State College

Here's a quick run down of our scholarship and their deadlines.

- Students with a minimum 2.7 GPA will receive a Success Award, no ACT required.
- · Board of Trustees, our highly competitive, full tuition waiver, does not require an ACT score, for

- submitted by January 15, 2021.
- Career Scholarship is a competitive scholarship for students majoring in Business, Criminal
 Justice, Computer Science or Education with a minimum 18 ACT score. An accepted application
 and personal statement submission is required. Priority deadline is December 1, 2020; secondary
 deadline is January 15, 2021.
- Corrections Leadership Scholarship is a unique collaboration between the Nebraska Department
 of Corrections & Peru State College for selected students studying Criminal Justice. It is valued at
 \$15,000 per year and students will work part time at Tecumseh State Corrections Institute. An
 accepted application and personal statement submission is required to be submitted by the
 January 15, 2021 deadline.
- Nebraska State College Guarantee is for Pell eligible students who will receive a combination of federal grants, state or private grants, college remissions, or College Foundation scholarships to fill any tuition gap left after the Pell Grant.

Peru State is now test optional. That's right! Students just need to complete our free online application and request their official high school transcript be sent to us. Once received – they are admitted.


