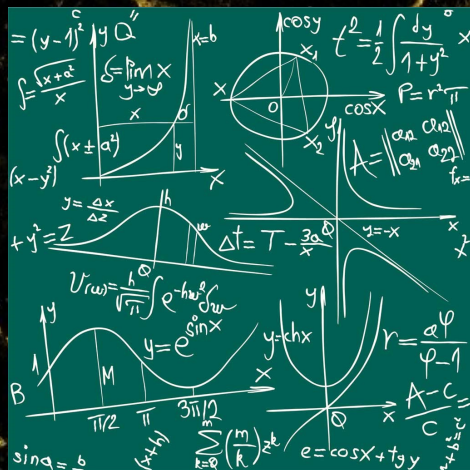

Nebraska STEM Scholars: Improving Student Success through Scholarship and Support Services

This WSC project is designed to grow participation in the STEM majors of biology, chemistry, and math. Over the next three (3) years the project will bring in up to six (6) students each year. Chosen participants will be academically talented and low income.

Program Benefits:

- ◆ Up to \$10,000 scholarship annually to cover unmet need
- ◆ Begin research in first year alongside a faculty mentor
- ◆ Attend regional science conferences annually
- ◆ Laptop issued to each student to assist in research
- ◆ Supplemental instruction and peer tutoring
- ◆ Career Assessment and counseling through WSC's Career Services office
- ◆ "Succeeding in the Sciences Week" to set a solid foundation for success the week before the first year in college
- ◆ Opportunity to join a Living Learning Community with other program participants
- ◆ Live in residence halls for 2 years

Program Eligibility:

- Students must be majoring in biology, chemistry or math (not healthcare, education or transfer)
- Must have a high school GPA of at least 3.0
- Must be eligible for a Pell grant
